

# AHCCCS Data to Inform Potential Federal Medicaid Changes

Prepared for:

Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System

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#### Introduction

The House of Representatives' budget resolution for fiscal year 2025 (House Concurrent Resolution 14) adopted on February 25, 2025 calls on the Committee on Energy and Commerce to reduce spending on programs within its jurisdiction by \$880 billion over the next ten years. Many of the options being considered by the Committee relate to the Medicaid program.

In Arizona, the Medicaid program is administered by the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS). AHCCCS continues to monitor federal proposals related to Medicaid and is committed to providing information to policymakers and stakeholders regarding the potential impacts on Arizona.

AHCCCS has contracted with Health Management Associates (HMA) to support the agency's analytic efforts. Founded in 1985, HMA is a leading independent, national research and consulting firm that provides technical assistance and training, facilitation and strategic planning, research and evaluation, policy development and recommendations, technical report writing, and analytical services with a focus on improving the administration and delivery of public health and human services programs.

This report provides data related to AHCCCS enrollment and payments to providers. In terms of enrollment, this report covers individuals receiving comprehensive Medicaid benefits through AHCCCS, grouped into the following categories:

- Traditional Medicaid covers select categories of children and adults, including SSI Cash, SSI Related, 1931 AHCCCS for Families and Children, SOBRA Child, SOBRA Pregnant, Transitional Medical Assistance, Freedom to Work, and Breast and Cervical Cancer Program. This group includes some individuals covered through Proposition 204, but excludes anyone eligible for the enhanced 90 percent federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) for Medicaid expansion groups.
- Expansion-Prop 204 includes the portion of the Proposition 204 population for whom AHCCCS receives a 90 percent FMAP. The voter-approved Prop 204 provides coverage to adults without dependent children ("childless adults") with incomes up to 100 percent of the federal poverty level (FPL).
- **Expansion-ACA** includes childless adults with incomes between 100 and 133 percent of the FPL. The Legislature approved this expansion group after passage of the federal Affordable Care Act (ACA). This group is also referred to as the "newly eligible" population.
- Arizona Long Term Care System (ALTCS) includes individuals who have an age-related disability, physical disability, or intellectual or developmental disability, and who require institutional level care.

## **Table Highlights**

As of January 1, 2025, about 1.8 million Arizonans received comprehensive Medicaid benefits through AHCCCS, including:

- More than 1.2 million individuals in the "traditional" Medicaid population.
- 500,000 individuals in the "expansion group" (most of whom have coverage through Proposition 204 approved by voters in 2000 and a smaller group that gained coverage through the legislated expansion adopted after passage of the federal Affordable Care Act).
- More than 72,000 individuals who are elderly, have significant physical disabilities, or have intellectual and developmental disabilities, and who are enrolled in the Arizona Long Term Care System (ALTCS).

## **Table Highlights**

AHCCCS provides health insurance to almost one-in-four Arizona residents; AHCCCS plays a particular important role in rural Arizona:

- More than 40 percent of residents in Apache, Graham, Navajo, and Santa Cruz Counties rely on Medicaid coverage.
- Employer-based insurance is much less prevalent in most rural counties than in Maricopa and Pima Counties; in Apache, La Paz, Navajo, Santa Cruz and Yuma Counties, more individuals have Medicaid than employer-based insurance.

#### **Table Highlights**

- More than one-third of Medicaid enrollees have a mental, behavioral, or neurodevelopmental disorder; more than one-third have an endocrine, nutritional, or metabolic disorder; and more the one-third have a disease of the respiratory system (individuals may have conditions in multiple diagnosis groups).
- Compared to the traditional Medicaid population, individuals in the expansion populations are more likely to receive a variety of care; for example (without adjusting for enrollee age):
  - They are 66 percent more likely to have received care associated with a mental, behavioral, or neurodevelopmental disorder.
  - 51 percent more likely to have received care for an endocrine, nutritional, or metabolic disorder.
  - 78 percent more likely to have received care for a circulatory disorder.
